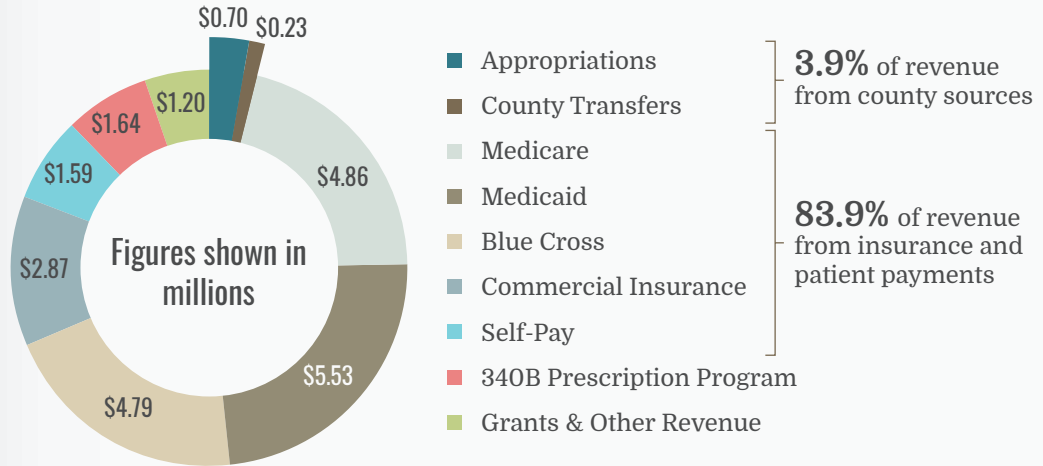

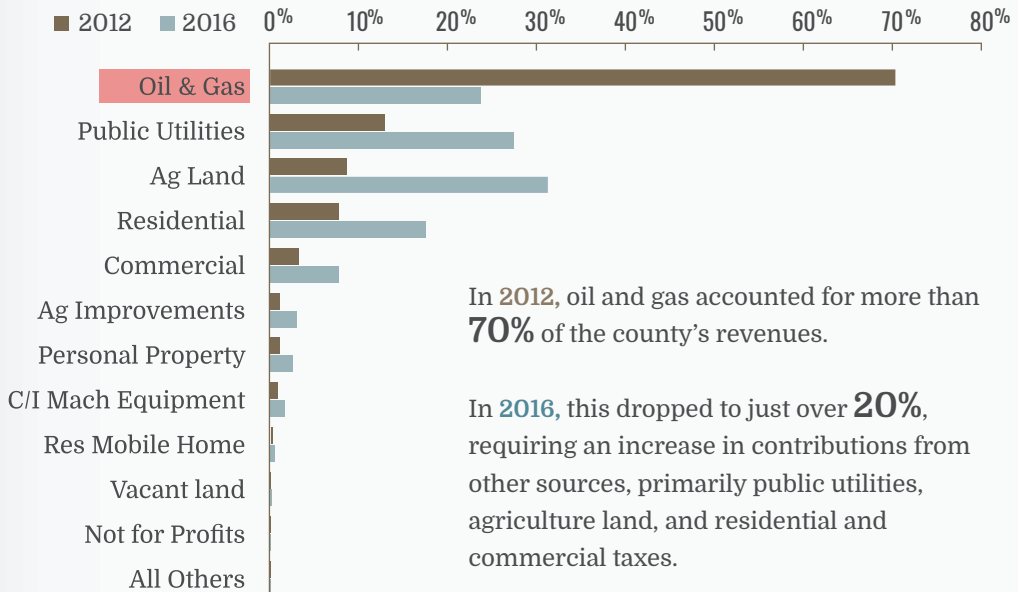

# FUNDING

In fiscal year 2017,\* Kearny County Hospital received nearly 84% of its revenue from patient payments, and less than 4% from county funds.

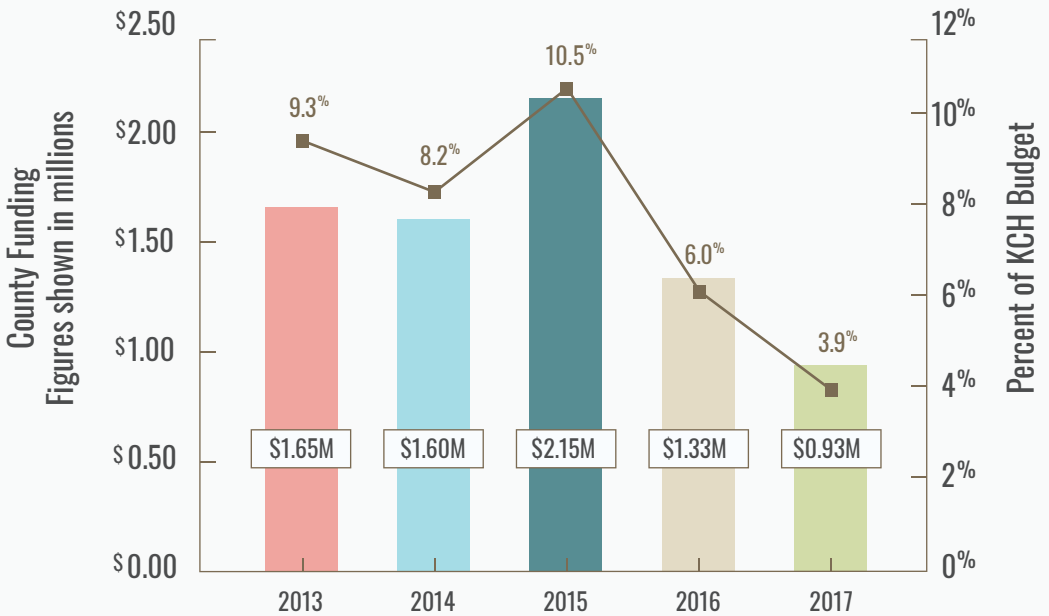


Between calendar years 2012-2016, county revenues from oil and gas dropped more than 70%.

Between 2013-2017, county funding to KCH dropped more than 44%, to a low of 3.9% of KCH budget.

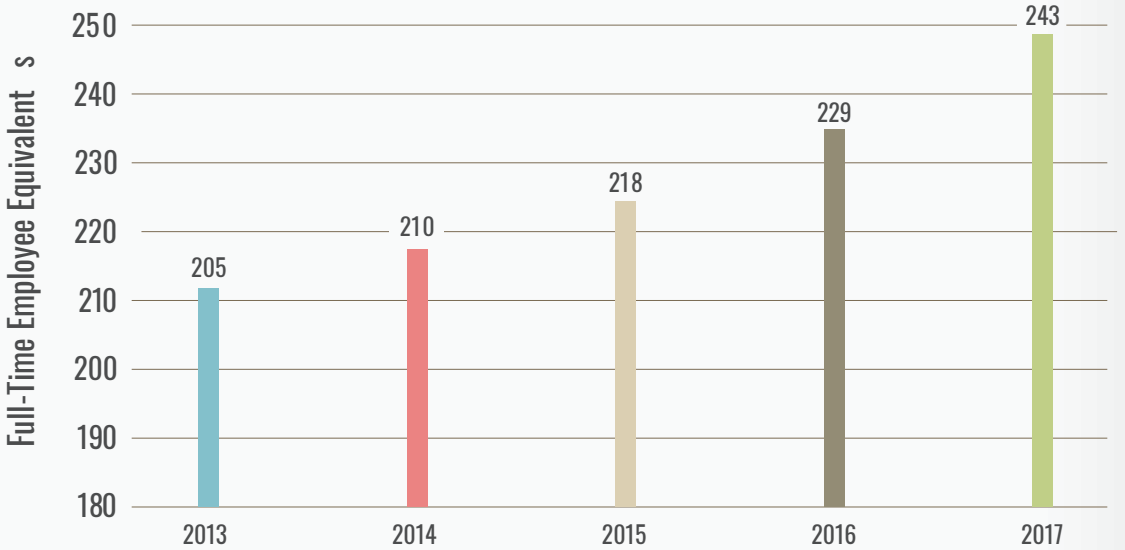

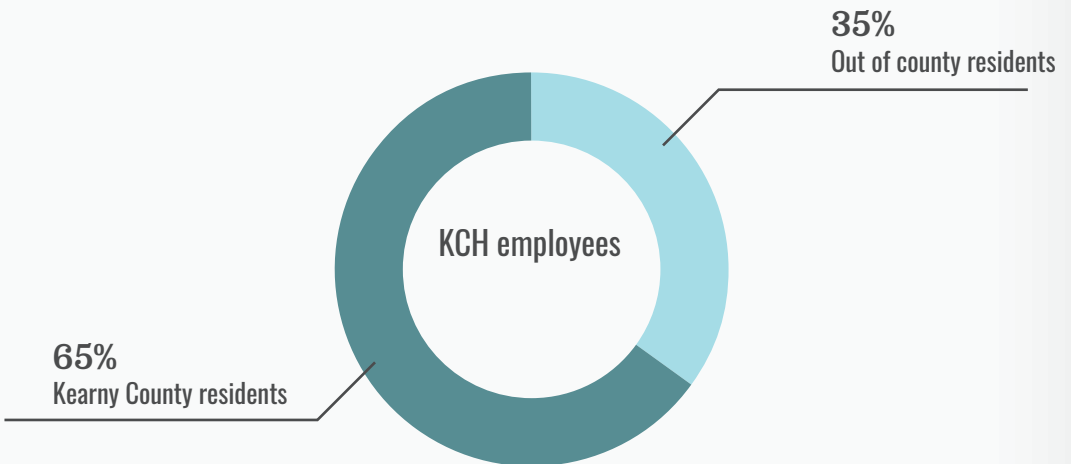


# EMPLOYEES

In fiscal year 2017, KCH employed the equivalent of 243 full-time employees and paid more than \$13M (55.1% of total budget) in employee wages.



Nearly 2/3 — 65% — of KCH employees reside in Kearny County.





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
